Do the Impossible

New Delhi: When little Rahul Chourasia – a six year old who displayed tremendous courage when two men attacked and killed his mother – handed over flowers to President Dr APJ Abdul Kalam at the Rashtrapati Bhavan here on Tuesday (23 January 2007), it was a chance for him and other National Bravery Award winners to get closer to their “hero”.

Paying tribute to the brave children who lost their lives trying to save others, Dr Kalam sad, “We would first like to remember these three great children. They are not us, but we all will remember their courage and what they have done for society”. Dr Kalam told the children that Gandhiji, at the age of twelve, was once told by his mother: “If you can in your entire lifetime save or better someone’s life, then your birth as a human being is a success.”

“Fortunately you have touched a human life, especially the three children who are no more”, Dr Kalam told the children. In an attempt to encourage the children to go ahead in life and accomplish bigger “miracles”, Dr Kalam also asked the children to take an oath to have the courage to do the impossible.

Asma Ayyub Khan, munching her sandwiches, could not believe that she had actually seen the President. Asma had saved 35 children from drowning at the

additional Bal Griha in Mumbai. Asma had led the children to safety through surging flood waters in 2005.

The awards ceremony was also attended by the parents and friends of these brave children. Whether the parent was a street hawker or a stand up comedian, all were equally proud of their children.
